Ngora Orphan & Vulnerable Children's Project



Buy a gift and help lift more children out of poverty

The Ngora Orphan & Vulnerable Children's Project (NOVC) has been running for 8 years and in that time your incredible generosity has supported 260 children throughout 3 years of their lives to keep them in school, protect them from malaria, help them to build sustainable livelihoods and provide them with highly useful skills training. As you did with the Kumi Orphan Project for the 6 years before, your support has transformed their lives and given them hope for the future.

This year the gifts are slightly different as the NOVC project is moving into a new and exciting phase when it will eventually evolve into a Resource and Training Centre for all children in the community and especially those youngsters who have had to drop out of secondary school.

There is likely to be an inevitable delay because of the lockdown in Uganda but, in the meantime, this year's fundraising will continue to support the 30 remaining project children as well as the hard pressed families in the community who are struggling to cope with the aftermath of the pandemic. You may notice that the life-saving mosquito nets are not included this year, but the good news is that the Ugandan government has pledged to supply them to every household!



Stationery £5

School pupils have to provide all their own stationery so children like Steven and Lawrance are given a year's supply of pens and exercise books each year, together with a Maths set, so that they can get the most out of their education.

Solar lamp £6

Solar lamps are much cleaner and safer than the kerosene lamps which are often the only source of light for a family when the sun goes down at 6.30 pm. They also help children like Lusi and Jennifer to study at night and are much prized.



Tip tap £6

Training for a family in how to build and maintain a 'tip tap' wash stand and provide them with a supply of soap. Never more important than now when frequent washing of hands plays a crucial part in combating Covid-19. Of course, good hygiene is always important and your donation will help others like Nelson to maintain good health long after the pandemic.

Tree seedlings £8

Training in the planting and aftercare of fruit trees, together with a supply of tree seedlings for improved family nutrition. Uganda suffers from severe deforestation and trees are vital to help combat soil erosion and the adverse effects of climate change. Grace is pictured in Moses' compound with her orange trees ready to plant in her family's compound.



Vegetable Seeds £10

This gift will provide crucial permaculture training to develop household kitchen gardens, together with a supply of vegetable seeds for more sustainable and productive food growing. This community garden is already well established and these children are going to benefit from a diet rich in nutritious vegetables.

Skills training £25 for 6 months, £50 for 12 months

Each month the children have gathered in their 3 separate year groups for high quality training by experienced trainers in a wide range of income generating skills, such as tailoring (pictured here), carpentry, weaving, machine knitting, shoe mending and others. They have a shining example in Mary Beisa, who left the project in 2014 and was sponsored on a vocational tailoring course on the strength of her project skills training. She now has her own successful tailoring business. There are very few ready-made clothes in Ugandan shops, often only available in the big cities so there is a great demand for tailoring.
